

ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS (ATC)

2) BID REJECTION CRITERIA

- (i) Failure to submit sufficient or complete details for evaluation of the bids within a week.
- (ii) Incomplete / misleading / ambiguous bids in the considered opinion of TNC /CNC.
- (iii) Bid with technical requirements and or terms not acceptable to MDL/Customers/External agency nominated as applicable.
- (iv) Any deviation sought, which is not accepted to MDL.
- (v) Bidders not submitting self-certification for local content.
- (vi) Bid received from non –local supplier i.e. Bidder who submit their quote with less than 20% local content.
- (vii) Any deviation w.r.t. of tender documents.
- (viii) **Bids received from other than nominated bidder indicated Sr no. 1 above will not be considered for the requirement.**

3) SUBMISSION OF OFFER IN TWO BID SYSTEM: Offer must be submitted in two parts as follows:

- (iii) Vendor shall submit a declaration in their letterhead that there are no adverse reports from any of their customers for this type of equipment supplied by them. In case any such adverse report/remark exist, the details of the same may be furnished along with the reference purchase order and customer details.

4) Pricing: - Price are firm and fixed till delivery of material to MDL Stores.

7) Liquidated Damages (LD): LD clause shall be applicable as per GeM terms and conditions.

8) INSPECTION: Receipt inspection will be done by MDL/WOT/Shipstaff. Other general conditions related to inspection of material are as under:

- (a) The decision of the Inspecting Authority or their representatives, as the case may be, on any question of the intent, meaning and the scope of Specifications / Standards shall be final, conclusive and binding on the Bidder/ Supplier / Contractor.
- (b) **Receipt Inspection:** MDL with Warship Overseeing Team (WOT) shall carry out necessary inspection of the items on receipt in the MDL on the basis of appropriate MDL Inspection system requirements & the Inspection documents submitted by suppliers. Any objection raised by MDL inspection team against quality of material or workmanship shall be satisfactorily corrected by the supplier at his expenses including replacement as may be required within shortest possible time within 30 days. Items damaged during transit shall also be rectified or replaced by the supplier within shortest possible time.
- (c) **Rejection of the material:** Any portion of the equipment found defective/rejected, the supplier shall collect the same at his cost from the MDL Yard, all incidental charges being born by supplier, (inclusive of custom duty, if payable), within 30 days from the date of intimation to the supplier of such rejection. The MDL reserves the rights to dispose-off the rejected item at the end of a total period of 90 days in any manner, to the best advantage to the MDL & recover storage charges & any consequential damages, from sale proceeds of such disposal.

9) Indemnification: The Bidder / Supplier / Contractor, his employees, licensees, agents or Sub-Supplier / Subcontractor, while on site of the Purchaser for the purpose of this contract, indemnifies the Purchaser against direct damage and/or injury to the property and/or the person of the Purchaser or that of Purchaser's employees, agents, Sub-Contractors / Suppliers occurring and to the extent caused by the negligence of the Bidder / Supplier / Contractor, his employees, licensees, agents or Subcontractor by making good such damages to the property, or compensating personal injury and the total liability for such damages or injury shall be as mutually discussed and agreed to.

10) Purchaser's Property: All property (such as materials, drawings, documents etc) issued by the Purchaser or any other individual or firm on behalf of the Purchaser in connection with the contract shall remain confidential, being the property of the Purchaser and the Bidder/Supplier/Contractor shall undertake to return all such property so issued and will be responsible for any or all loss thereof and damage thereto resulting from whatever causes and shall reimburse the Purchaser the full amount of loss and damage.

11) Issuance of e-Invoice by Vendor:

- (b) Whenever GST is applicable, payment will be released against e-Invoice, or Invoice accompanied with vendor's self-declaration that" we do not fall under the category of registered persons notified under Rule 48(4) of the central GST Rule 2017 and we are not required to comply with e-invoicing provisions under GST Act, as our aggregate turnover in any preceding financial year from 2017-18 onward has not exceeded Rs10 Cr as per GST Act".
